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Executive Summary

This deliverable reports on the development of the INTENS project website as in the description of WP6, Task 6.1.

The INTENS website general architecture is very simple and user-friendly, since its main aim is to disseminate the results of the project and provide public information on the work carried out.

In addition, a private section is available for partners to transfer and share data collaboratively.

1. Introduction

The set-up of a project website is part of the tasks to be carried out within WP6, Task 6.1 “Dissemination and communication”.

Although this deliverable was initially under the responsibility of UEDIN, due to the restricted budget of this partner and the high cost of the summer schools, it was finally decided that the coordinating beneficiary (UCL) would be taking charge of its set up and maintenance during the project lifetime with its own financial resources. This will not have an impact on UCL’s budget, since its set up has been based on the premise of cost-effectiveness.

1.1. General context

The project website serves the key purpose of informing professionals, patients and the wider public on the progress of the project, as well as disseminating other platforms relevant for the Short Bowel Syndrome (SBS), such as the EuroStemCell, PINNT and the Short Gut Foundation.

This public website is the main contact point for external users and does not only include general information on the project and the partners involved, but will also provide updates on the progress made by INTENS, including all dissemination activities and foreseen events. The web site also contains a ‘contact us’ tab for interested stakeholders to pose questions to the Consortium.

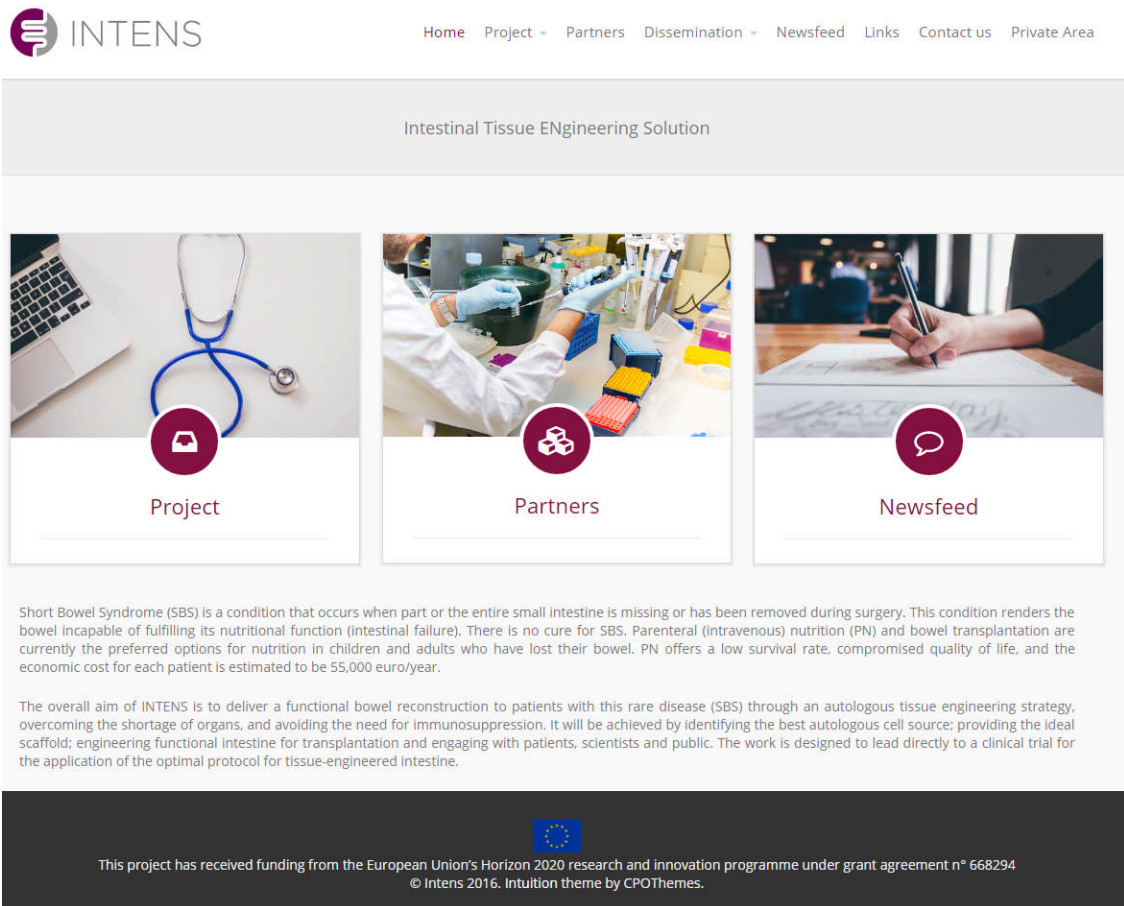

To this same end, INTENS partners will also use Dropbox and Google Sheets, since these tools are very easy to use and allow the online entry of data in a single document.

2. Summary of activities

The URL of the INTENS website is www.intens.info



The INTENS website includes different tabs as follows:

Home

The Homepage displays links to the three pages considered most important or useful via three images and titles linking to the three website's pages:

- Project
- Partners
- Newsfeed

The homepage includes a brief description of the Short Bowel Syndrome (SBS) and the goals of the INTENS project. The logo of the project and its title are visible as the header of the webpage. It is important to highlight that the EU emblem is displayed and the reference to EU funding is shown at the bottom of the homepage.

Project

The Project page displays a summary of the project with a focus on the challenge being addressed, the objectives and key figures of the project (e.g. start date, EU contribution and so on). This tab links to the following different subsections:

- Workplan: including a summary of the interconnection between the different Work Packages and a demonstrative diagram.

- Management structure: including a brief description of each consortium body and a graph showing relationships between them.
- Results and impacts: including a summary of the main impact that INTENS intends to have.

Partners

The Partners page displays a short summary of the consortium. After this, all partners are listed next to its institutional logo with a link to each organisation's web site. For better reference, the principal investigator of each organisation is also mentioned.

Dissemination

The Dissemination page includes different subsections to:

- Media: it will include information on press releases, briefings, etc.
- Communications: it will show a list of events (workshops, conferences, etc.) in which INTENS delegates have participated on behalf of the Consortium.
- Publications: it will provide details on the publications prepared by partners.
- Deliverables: those classified as "public" will be posted.

This page will be especially useful for engaging with external project partners including patients and families. Given its relevance, it will be regularly updated, as new dissemination activities occur.

Newsfeed

The Newsfeed page will include information on the latest news related to the project, including photos and details about project meetings held, activities organised by partners and events in which INTENS partners will take part, among others.

For clarification purposes, feeds will be automatically classified as "Recent posts" or stored in "Archives". These will be available in the menu at the right hand side of the page.

Links

The Links page displays links to patient organisations and other relevant organisations, associated research projects, etc. such as the EuroStemCell, the Short Bowel Syndrome Foundation and the Patients on Intravenous and Nasogastric Nutrition. More links will be added as considered relevant.

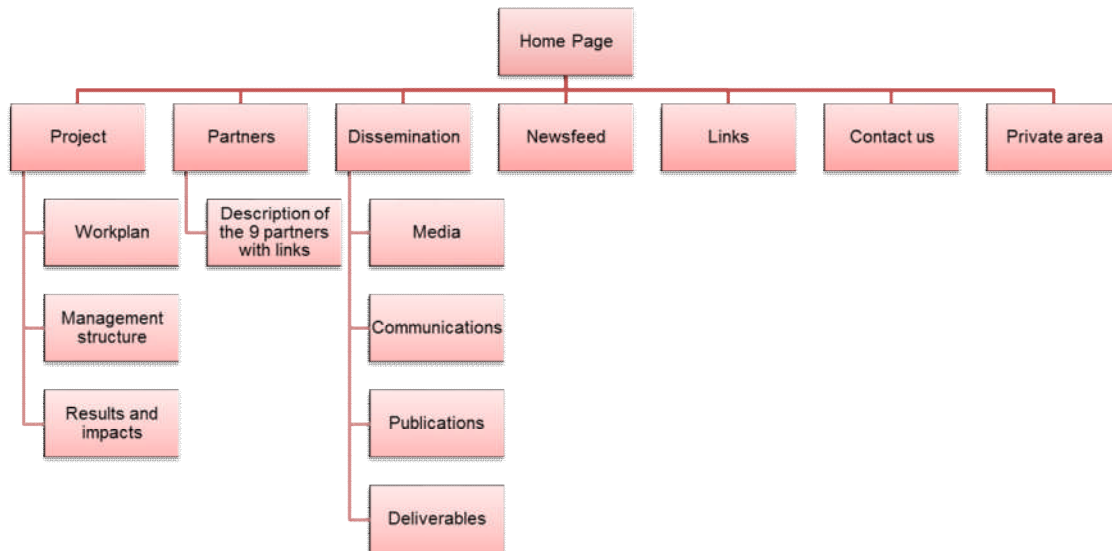
Contact us
